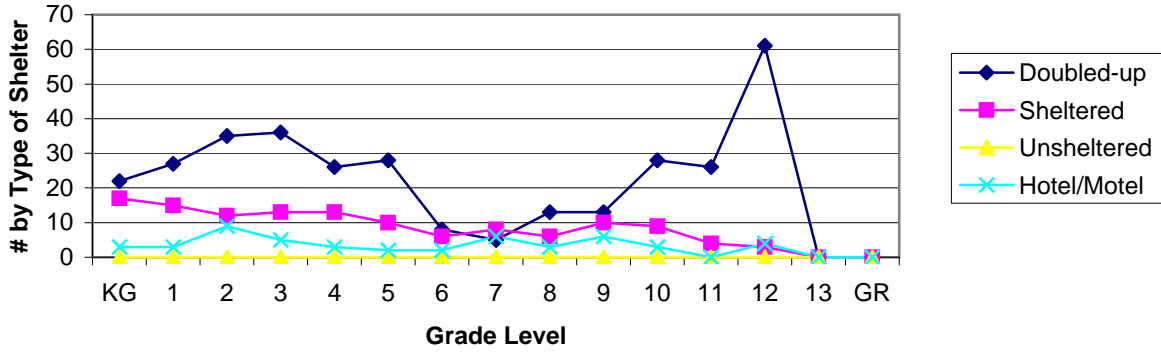

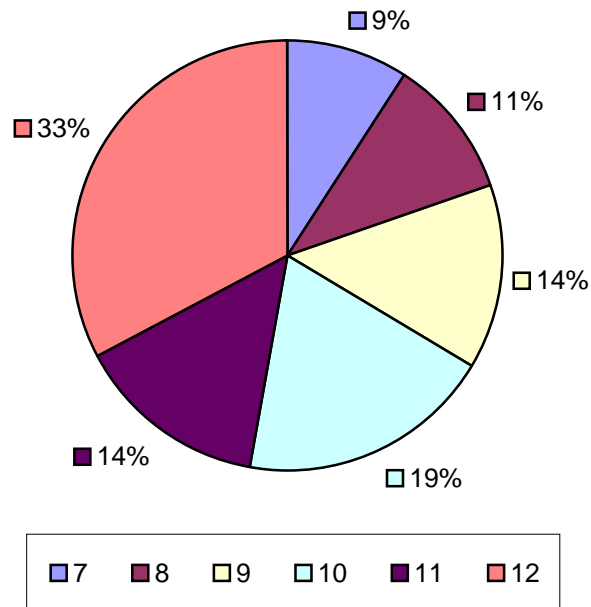
HIGHLIGHTS

- In the '08-'09 school year, Evansville Vanderburgh School Corp. identified 503 students who had experienced homelessness sometime during the school year.
- Of that number, 208 or 41% were teenagers (grades 7-12). (No data exists yet for knowing the number of teens who were on their own or "unaccompanied.")
- Of the total number of teens, during their experience of homelessness,
 - 70% were doubled-up,
 - 19% were sheltered, and
 - 11% were in a hotel/motel.
- Most teenagers who experienced homelessness in the '08-09 school year were in 12th grade, or 33% were seniors.
- In shelters, the highest number of teens were in 9th grade, followed closely by 10th graders.
- For K-6 grades, 2nd & 3rd graders were among the highest numbers experiencing homelessness. Most were in doubled-up situations.
- The most prevalent grade level of student in Sheltered situations was Kindergarten.
